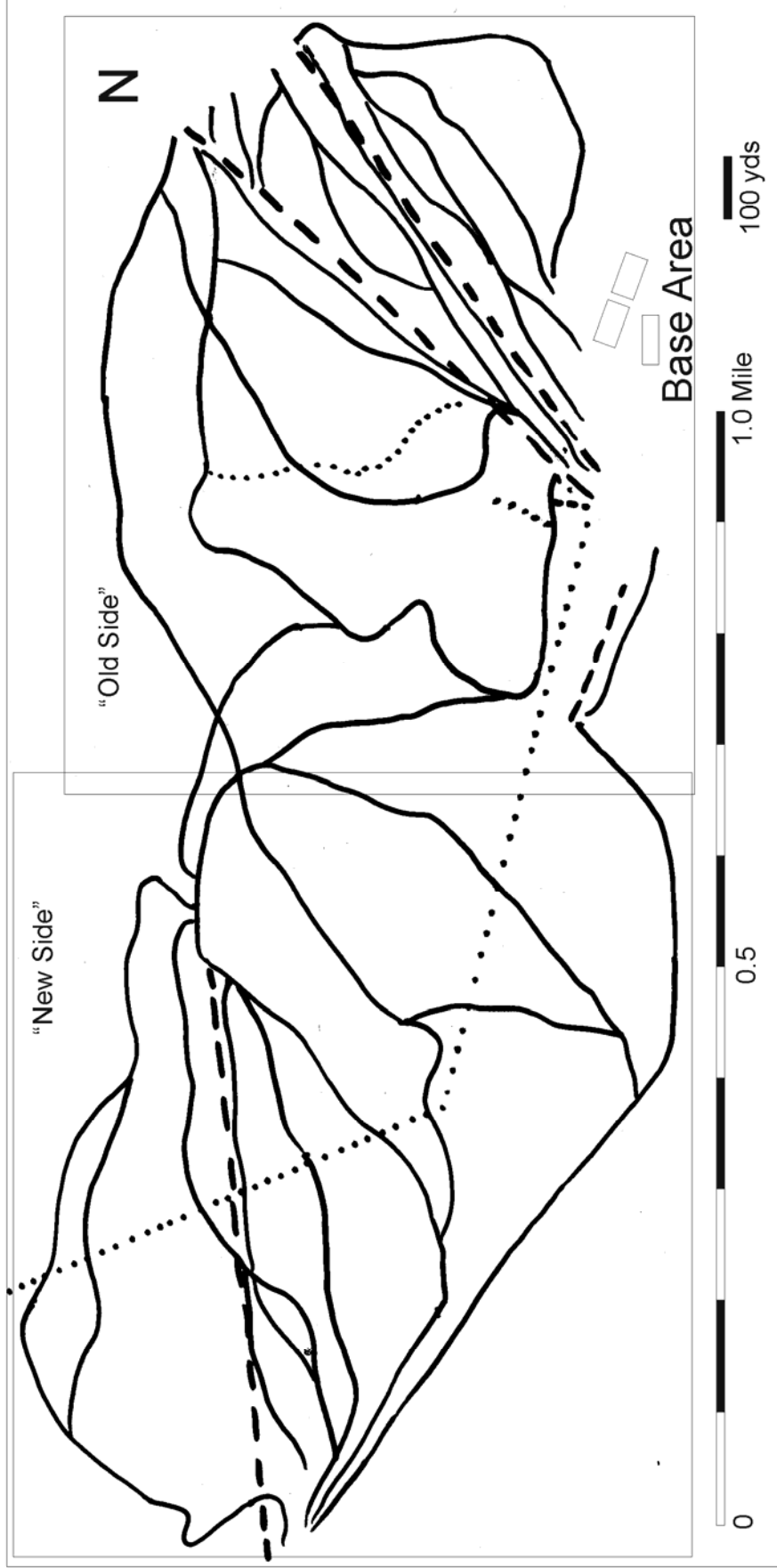

Surface Features of the Snowy Range Ski Area

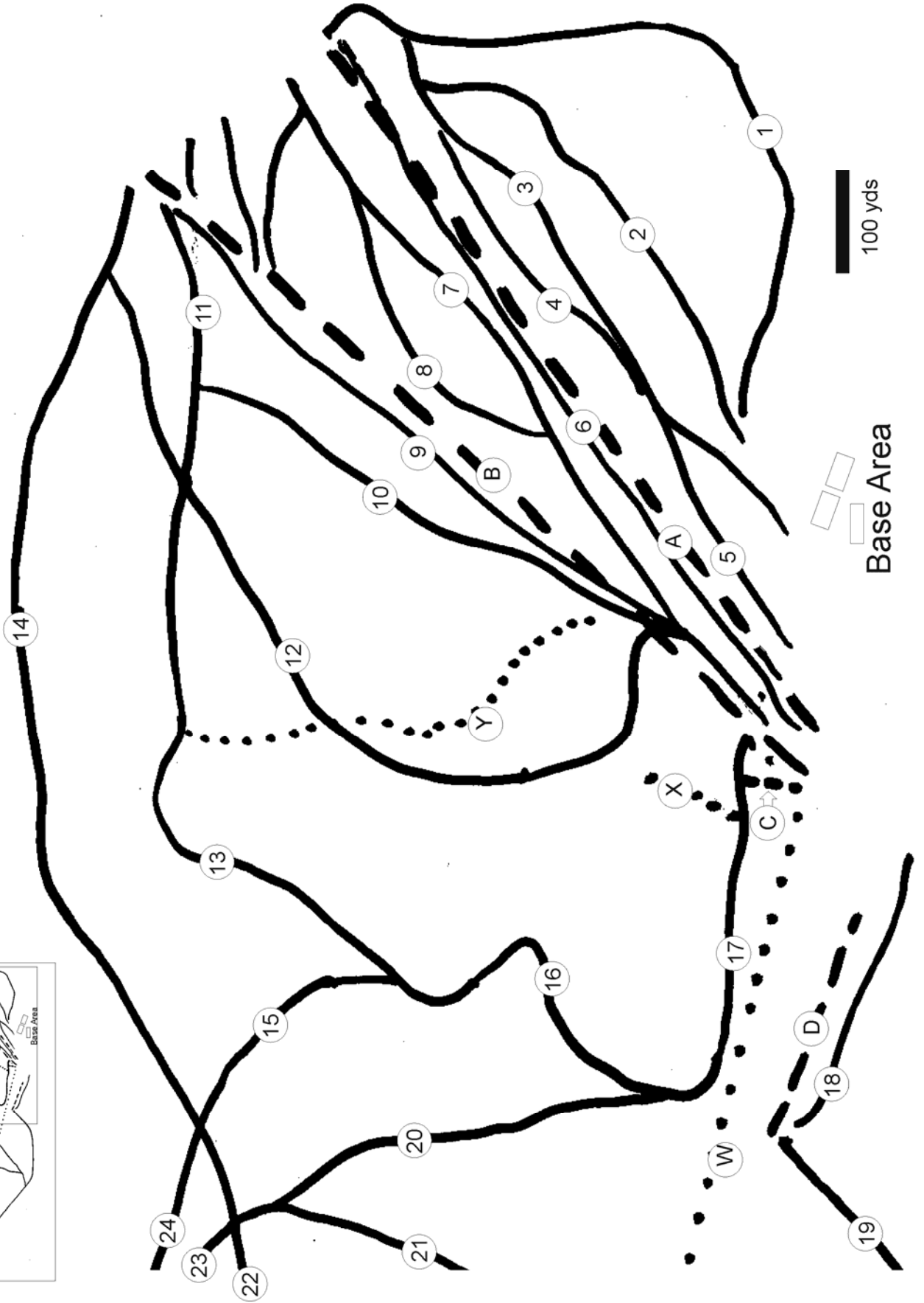
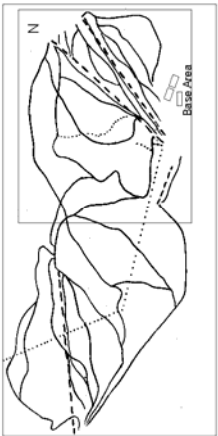

- Dotted Lines = "Other Features"

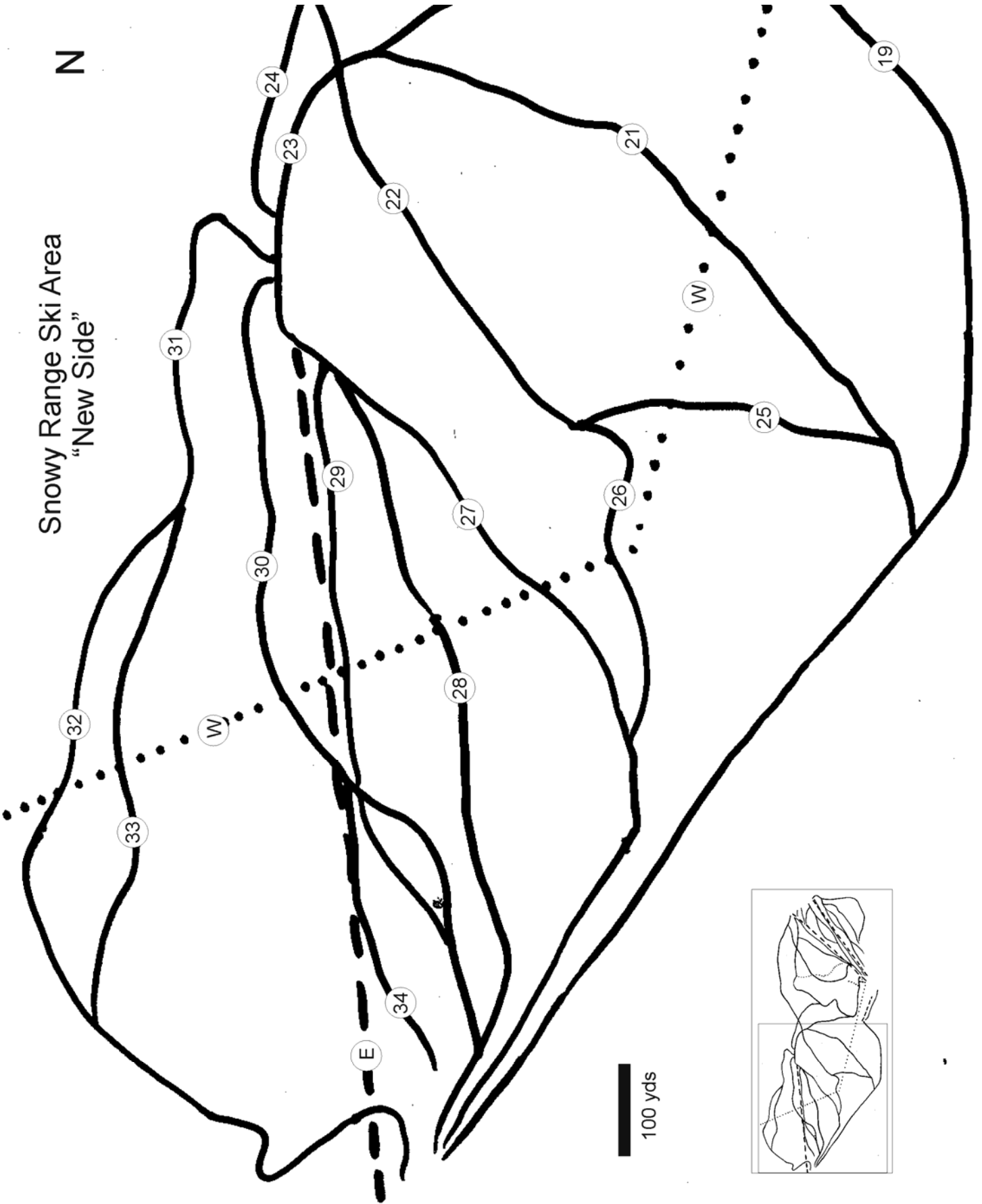
Snowy Range Ski Area "Old Side"

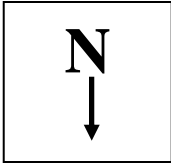
